

## Red flags when boarding your pet

Choosing where to board your pet is an important decision. You want to know they'll be safe, comfortable, and cared for while you're away. A quick check for common red flags can help you avoid problems and feel confident your pet is in good hands.

## What to watch out for:

- Poor cleanliness strong odors, dirty kennels, or unclean common areas
- Limited staff or no visible supervision
- No vaccination requirements for all animals
- Unclear or restrictive visiting hours
- No emergency plan or vet on call
- Staff who avoid answering questions directly
- No clear feeding, exercise, or medication routines
- Overcrowding or unsafe enclosures
- No trial day or meet-and-greet option

- ✓ Tour the facility in person trust your senses!
- ✓ Ask for references or reviews.
- ✓ Confirm what's included (playtime, walks, feeding schedules).
- ✓ Understand policies for emergencies or illness.
